
Background

Mitigation

Hazard mitigation planning reduces loss of life and property by minimizing the impact of disasters. It begins with identifying natural, human-caused, or technological disaster risks and vulnerabilities that are common in the area. After identifying these risks, then developing long-term strategies for protecting people and property from similar events. Mitigation plans are key to breaking the cycle of disaster damage and reconstruction.






Preparedness

Preparedness is defined by DHS/FEMA as "a continuous cycle of planning, organizing, training, equipping, exercising, evaluating, and taking corrective action in an effort to ensure effective coordination during incident response." This cycle is one element of a broader National Preparedness System to prevent, respond to, and recover from natural disasters, acts of terrorism, and other disasters.

- Move to an interior room on
- the lowest level Stay away from windows and exterior doors
- Follow directives from emergency personnel.
- After the storm passes, stay clear of damaged areas. Be aware of hazards

- Follow A-RACE
- ACTIVE: Pull fire alarm
- RESCUE: If safe, assist other personnel out of the area.
- ALERT: From a safe location. Call 303-724-4444
- CONFINE: Close doors as you exit.
- EXTINGUISH: If safe. extinguish the fire.
 - FVACUATE: Follow exits.

- ACTIVE HARMER Run, Hide, Fight
- Run: Attempt to evacuate as far as possible on foot · Hide: Seek a hiding place out
- of the harmers view . Fight: As a last resort, attempt
- to incapacitate the active
- Follow directive from emergency personnel.





- Call 303-724-4444
- Provide location, nature of illness/injury, the current condition of the victim.
- Do not move the victim unless in immediate danger.
- If trained, begin first aid/CPR/AED as needed.
- Send someone to meet emergency responders.

- Call 303-724-4444 from a land line phone.
- Follow directives from emergency personnel.
- · If evacuating, assemble at designated rally points.
- Restrict unnecessary cellphone or radio usage
- Avoid area until authorized by emergency personnel.



MATERIALS Stay Back

- Evacuate the area, closing assemble at designated rally

- · Support and use a "buddy system" to assist people with mobility or functional needs.
- If you are unable to assist. notify emergency responders of the location and the number of persons who need help in the area.

The Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP), establishes the basis for providing emergency response resources and assistance to the campus community if impacted by emergency or disasters.

The CEMP covers all four phases of emergency management: mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery.

The following document represents the all-hazards, comprehensive emergency management plan for the University of Colorado Anschut Medical Campus. This plan was developed through a collaborative planning process involving key university and external stakeholders University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus Police Department -Emergency Management Division



What is COOP?

An effort within individual executive departments and agencies to ensure that Primary Mission Essential Functions (PMEFs) continue to be performed during a wide range of emergencies, including localized acts of nature, accidents and technological or attack-related emergencies (Inclement Weather).

Why is it Important?

Planning fosters recovery and survival in and after emergency situations.

COOP establishes processes and procedures that allow for the continuation of essential functions when you can't be in your normal workspace, or a significant portion of your staff is absent (COVID-19).
