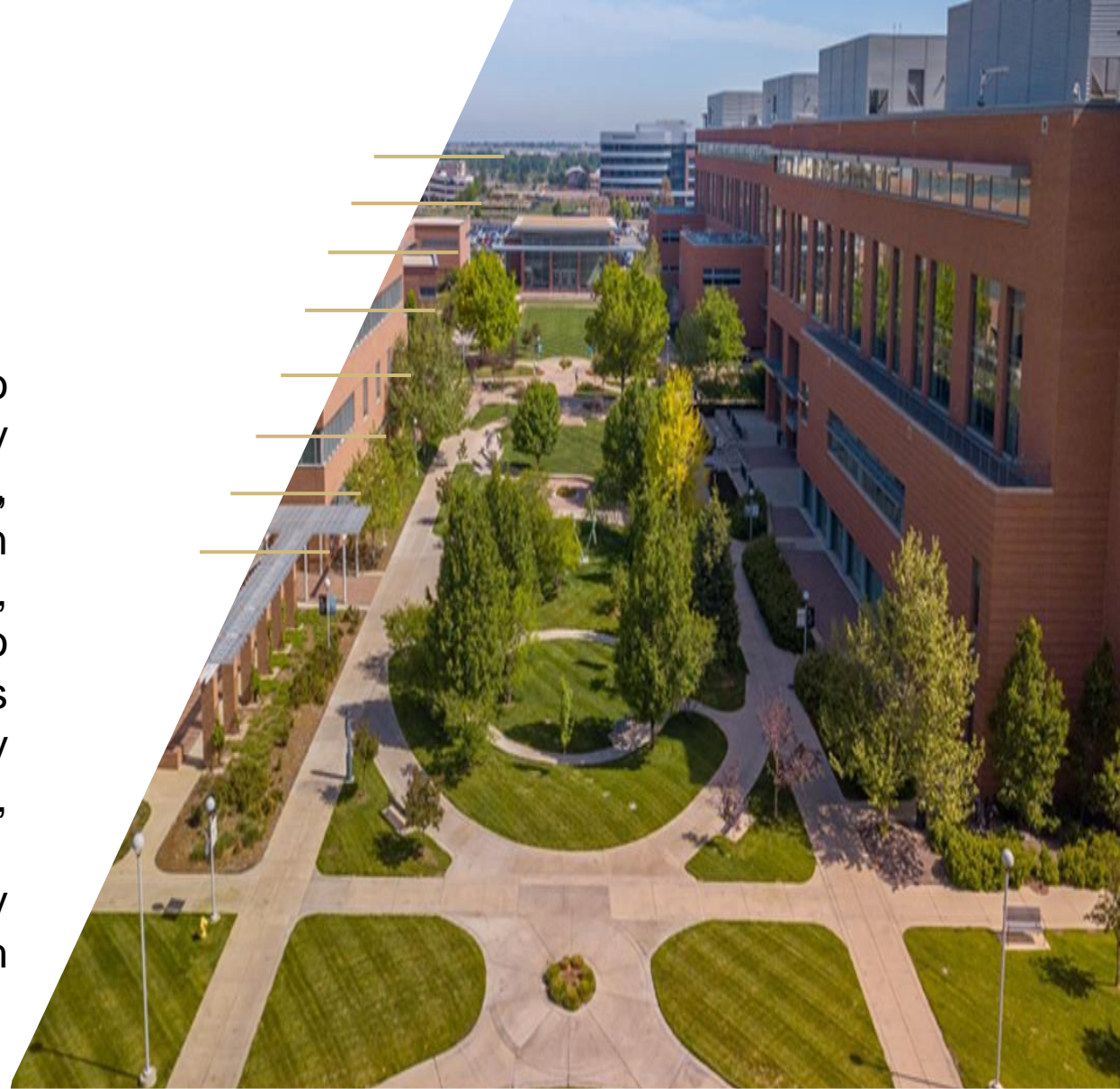

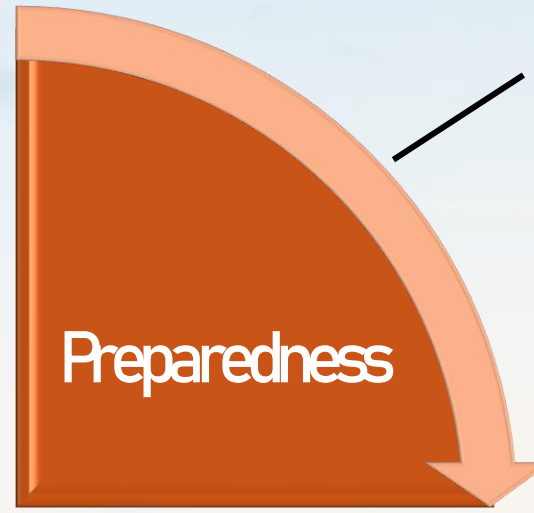

Mitigation

Hazard mitigation planning reduces loss of life and property by minimizing the impact of disasters. It begins with identifying natural, human-caused, or technological disaster risks and vulnerabilities that are common in the area. After identifying these risks, then developing long-term strategies for protecting people and property from similar events. Mitigation plans are key to breaking the cycle of disaster damage and reconstruction.

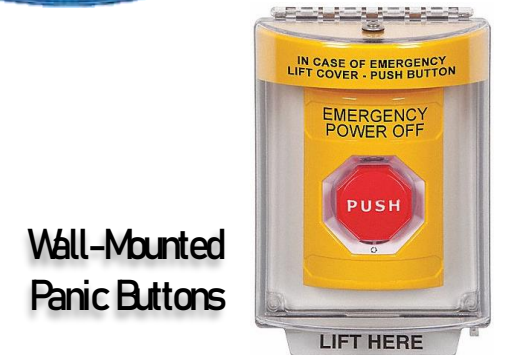
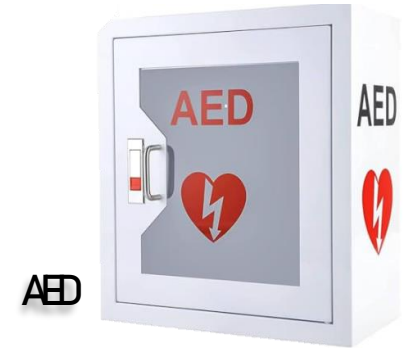
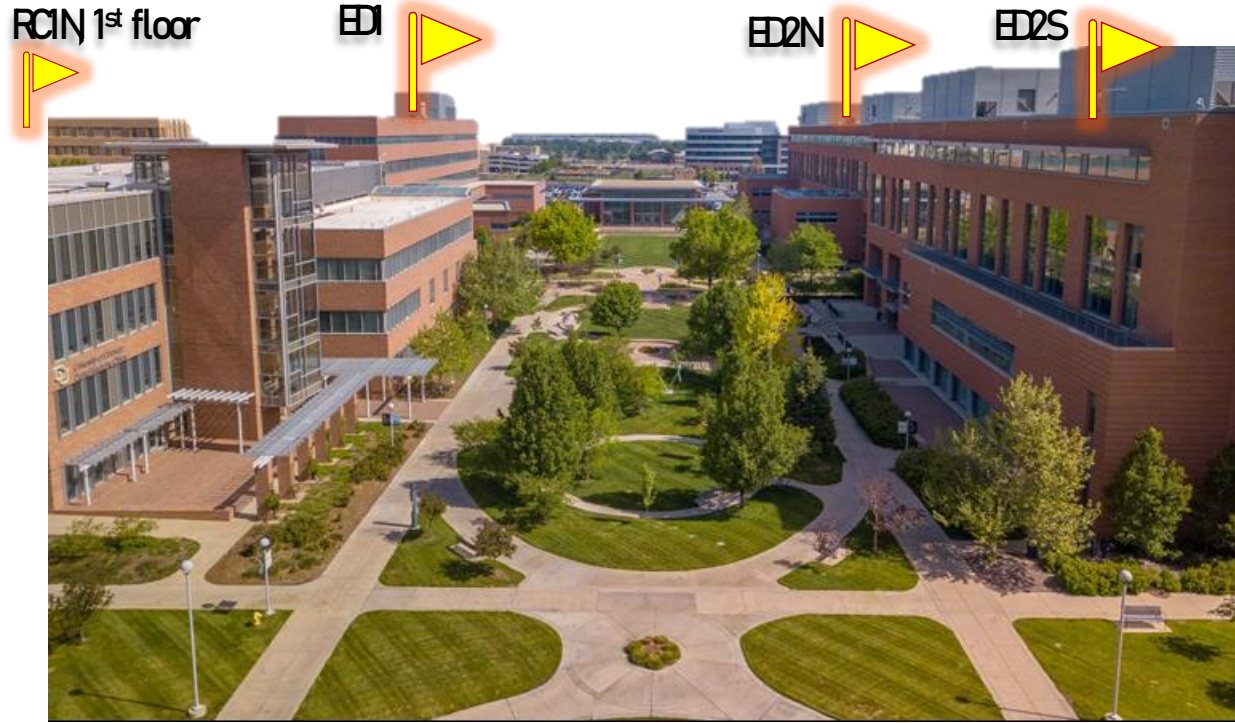

Preparedness

Preparedness is defined by DHS/FEMA as "a continuous cycle of planning, organizing, training, equipping, exercising, evaluating, and taking corrective action in an effort to ensure effective coordination during incident response." This cycle is one element of a broader National Preparedness System to prevent, respond to, and recover from natural disasters, acts of terrorism and other disasters.

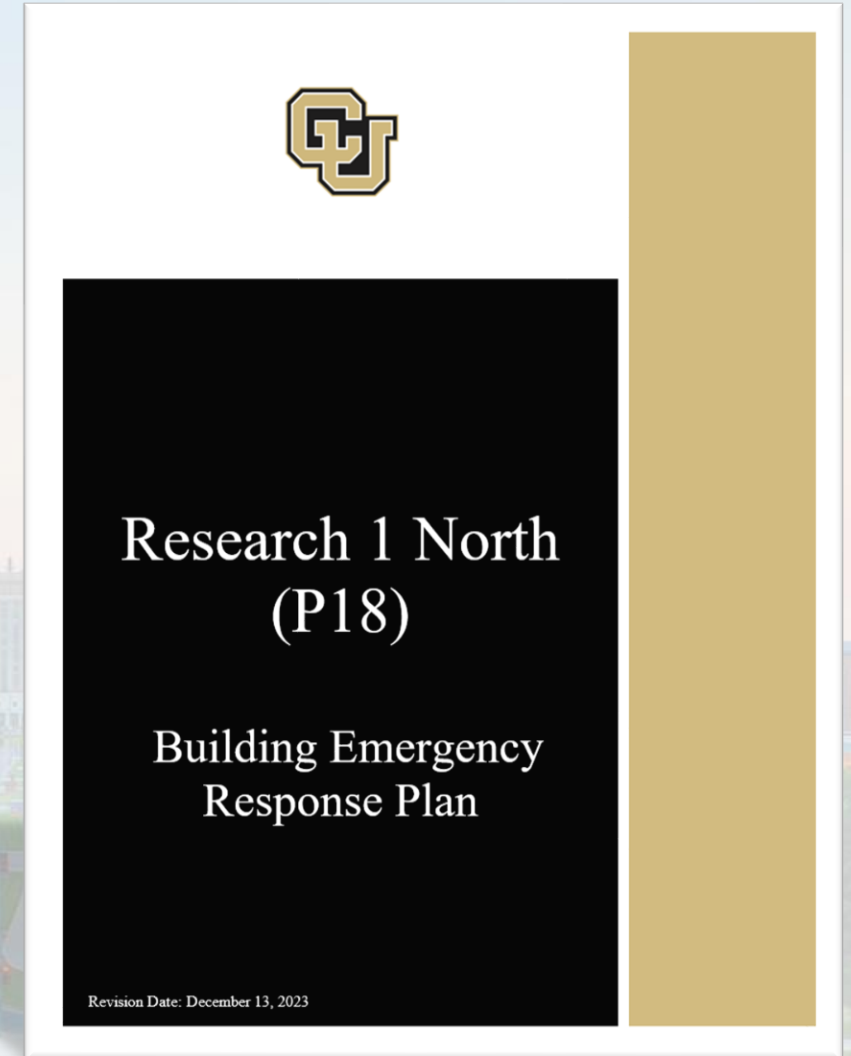

Call 303-724-4444. Report objects out of the ordinary or present a significant concern. Report persons behaving strangely, displaying signs of distress, or erratic behavior. If non-life-threatening, call CU Anschutz Environmental Health & Safety 303-724-0345. 	<div style="background-color: #f0e68c; padding: 5px; display: flex; align-items: center;">  <div style="margin-left: 5px;"> <p>ACCESS & FUNCTIONAL NEEDS Think Inclusion</p> </div> </div> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Support and use a "buddy system" to assist people with mobility or functional needs. If you are unable to assist, notify emergency responders of the location and the number of persons who need help in the area.

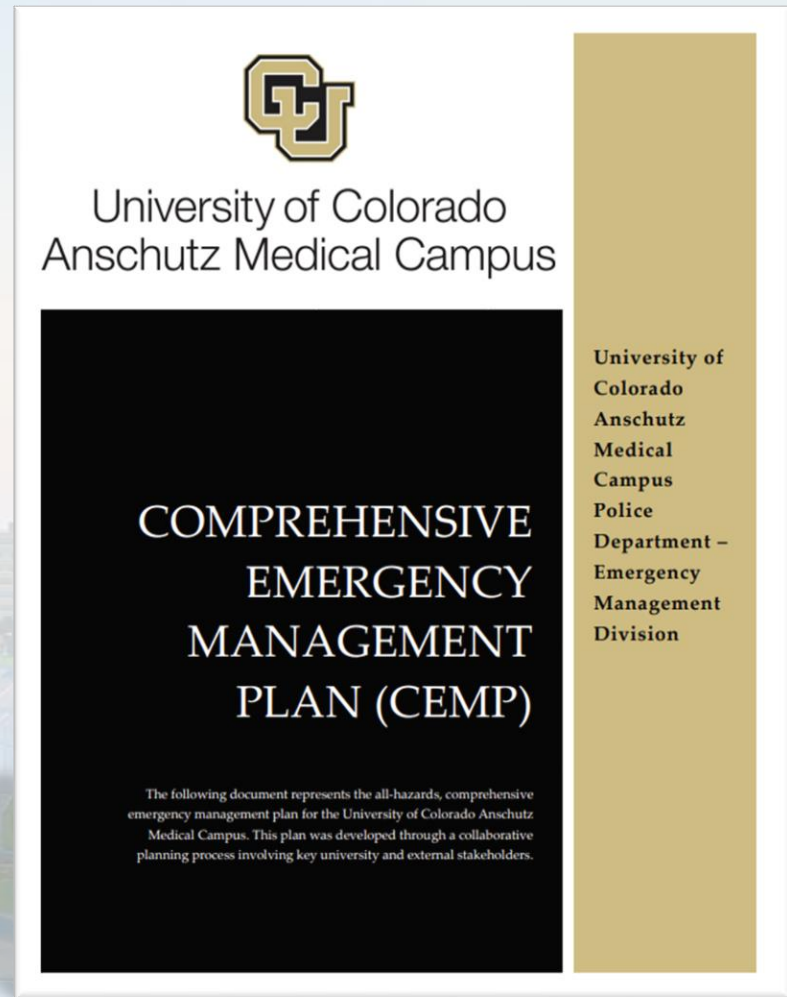

The Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP), establishes the basis for providing emergency response resources and assistance to the campus community if impacted by emergency or disasters.

The CEMP covers all four phases of emergency management: mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery

What is COOP?

An effort within individual executive departments and agencies to ensure that Primary Mission Essential Functions (PMEFs) continue to be performed during a wide range of emergencies, including localized acts of nature, accidents and technological or attack-related emergencies (Inclement Weather).

Why is it Important?

Planning fosters recovery and survival in and after emergency situations.

COOP establishes processes and procedures that allow for the continuation of essential functions when you can't be in your normal workspace, or a significant portion of your staff is absent (COVID-19).

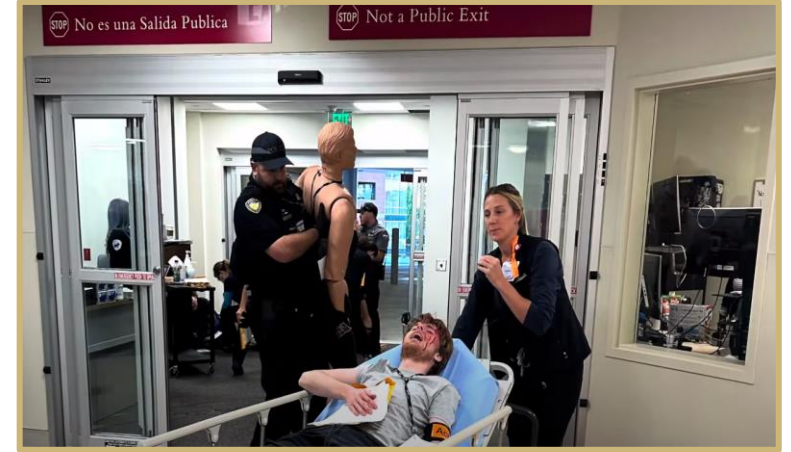

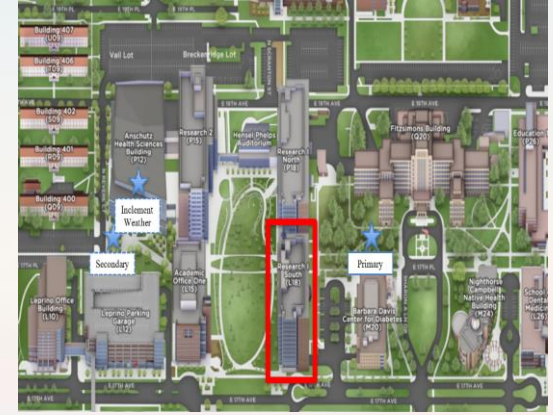

Response

Response activities that address the short-term, direct effects of an incident. Response includes immediate actions to save lives, protect property, and meet basic human needs. Response also includes the execution of emergency operations plans and of mitigation activities designed to limit the loss of life, personal injury, property damage, and other unfavorable outcomes.

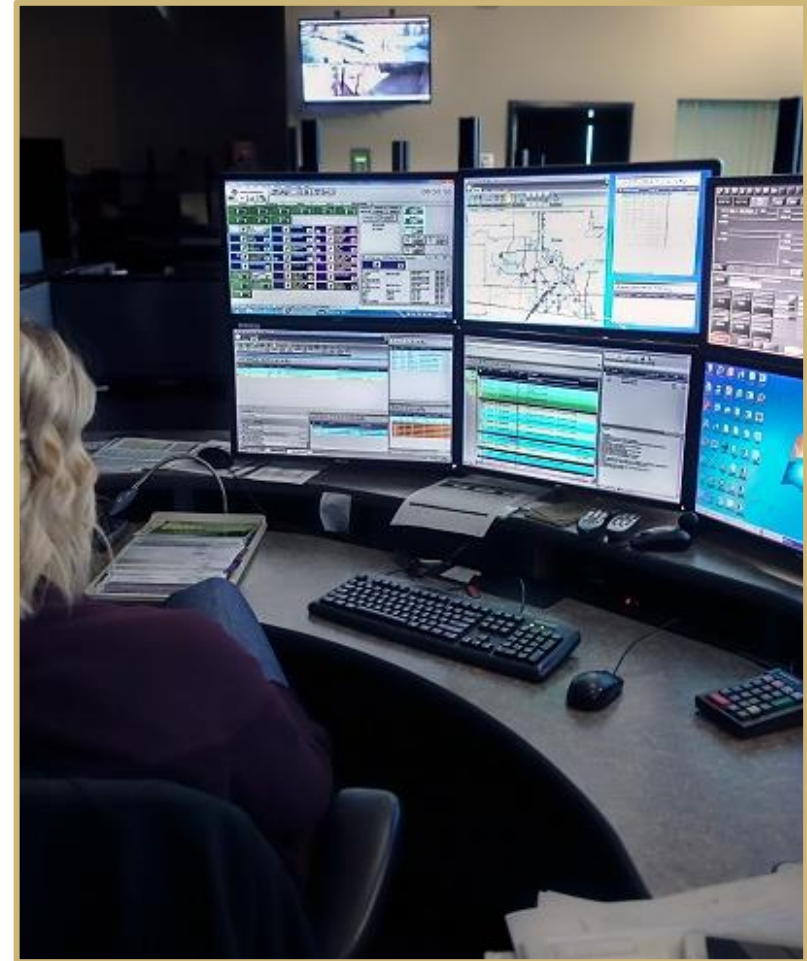
When Calling Dispatch: 303-724-4444

Police Dispatch

Be prepared to answer the following questions:

- Non-Emergencies
- ✓ **Where** – Where did the event take place?
- ✓ **What** – What happened?
- ✓ **Description** – Description of the suspect
- ✓ **Weapons** – Were there any weapons involved?
- ✓ **Welfare** – Does anyone need an ambulance?

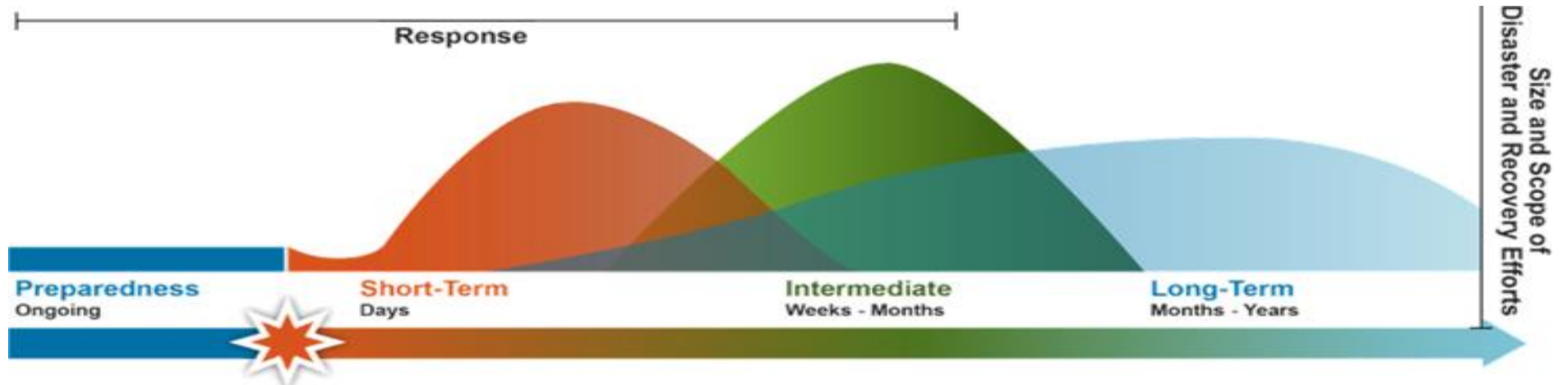
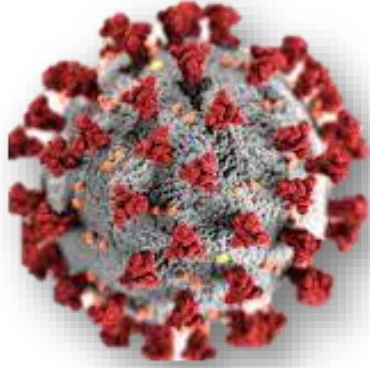
