Mitigation

Hazard mitigation planning reduces loss of life and property by minimizing the impact of disasters. It begins with identifying natural, human-caused, or technological disaster risks and vulnerabilities that are common in the area. After identifying these risks, then developing long-term strategies for protecting people and property from similar events. Mitigation plans are key to breaking the cycle of disaster damage and reconstruction.

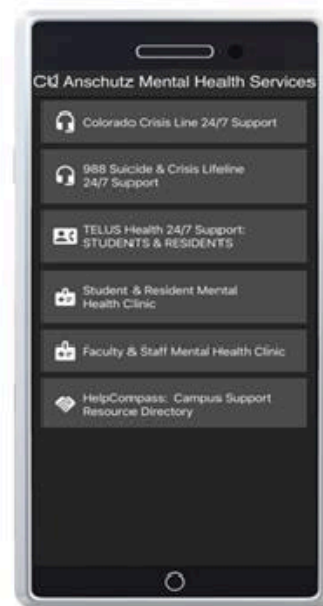
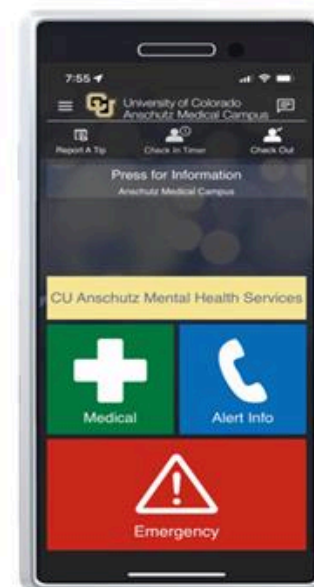

Preparedness

Preparedness is defined by DHS/FEMA as "a continuous cycle of planning, organizing, training, equipping, exercising, evaluating, and taking corrective action in an effort to ensure effective coordination during incident response." This cycle is one element of a broader National Preparedness System to prevent, respond to, and recover from natural disasters, acts of terrorism, and other disasters.

The Emergency Response Guide is a 1-page flyer that is posted throughout the facilities that outlines scenario- specific actions that may be critical to ensure the safety of tenants and or others visiting the facility.

EMERGENCY

SEVERE WEATHER
Calmly Seek Shelter

- Move to an interior room on the lowest level.
- Stay away from windows and exterior doors.
- Follow directives from emergency personnel.
- After the storm passes, stay clear of damaged areas. Be aware of hazards.

FIRE
Follow A-RACE

- **ACTIVE:** Pull fire alarm.
- **RESCUE:** If safe, assist other personnel out of the area.
- **ALERT:** From a safe location, Call 303-724-4444.
- **CONFINE:** Close doors as you exit.
- **EXTINGUISH:** If safe, extinguish the fire.
- **EVACUATE:** Follow exits.

ACTIVE HARMER
Run, Hide, Fight

- **Run:** Attempt to evacuate as far as possible on foot.
- **Hide:** Seek a hiding place out of the harmer's view.
- **Fight:** As a last resort, attempt to incapacitate the active harmer.
- Follow directive from emergency personnel.

MEDICAL EMERGENCY
Take Action

- Call 303-724-4444.
- Provide location, nature of illness/injury, the current condition of the victim.
- Do not move the victim unless in immediate danger.
- If trained, begin first aid/CPR/AED as needed.
- Send someone to meet emergency responders.

BOMB THREAT
Remain Calm

- Call 303-724-4444 from a land line phone.
- Follow directives from emergency personnel.
- If evacuating, assemble at designated rally points.
- Restrict unnecessary cellphone or radio usage.
- Avoid area until authorized by emergency personnel.

SUSPICIOUS OBJECTS/ACTIVITY
See Something Say Something

- Trust your instincts and err on the side of caution.
- Call 303-724-4444.
- Report objects out of the ordinary or present a significant concern.
- Report persons behaving strangely, displaying signs of distress, or erratic behavior.
- Report sexual misconduct.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS
Stay Back

- Evacuate the area, closing doors behind you, and assemble at designated rally points.
- Call 303-724-4444.
- Provide location and description of hazard and known and any injuries.
- If non-life-threatening, call CU Anschutz Environmental Health & Safety 303-724-0345.

ACCESS & FUNCTIONAL NEEDS
Think Inclusion

- Support and use a "buddy system" to assist people with mobility or functional needs.
- If you are unable to assist, notify emergency responders of the location and the number of persons who need help in the area.

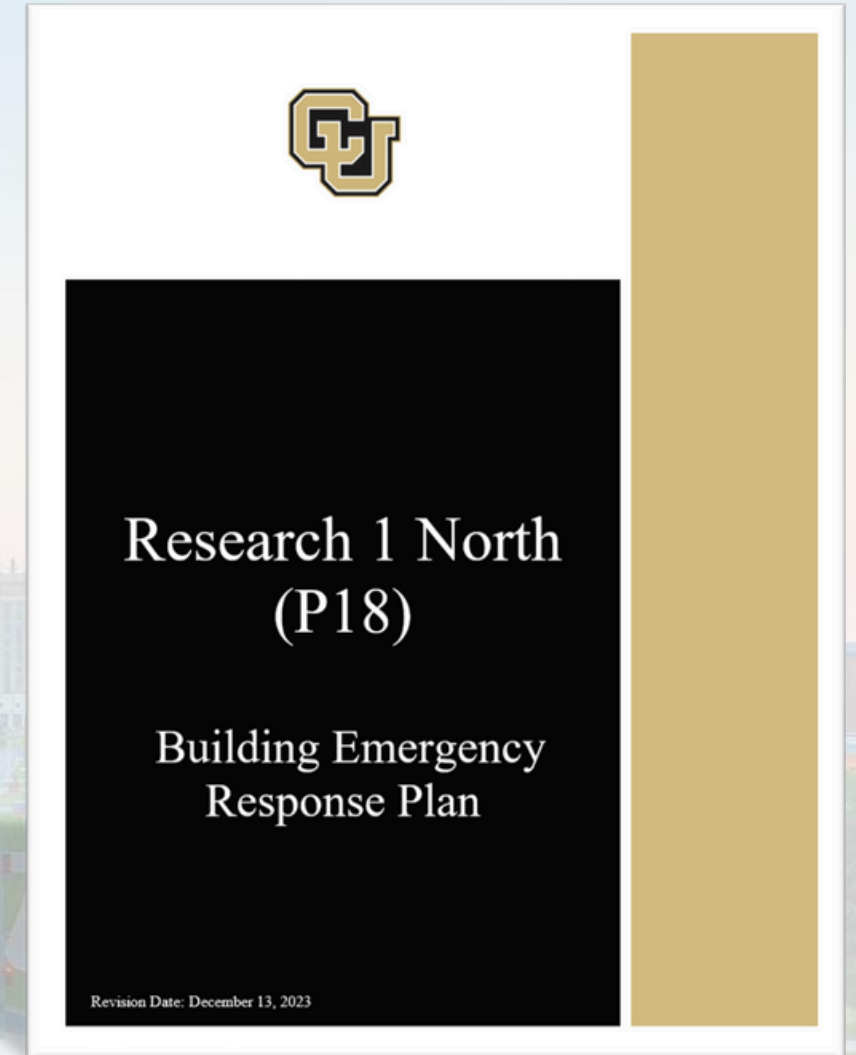

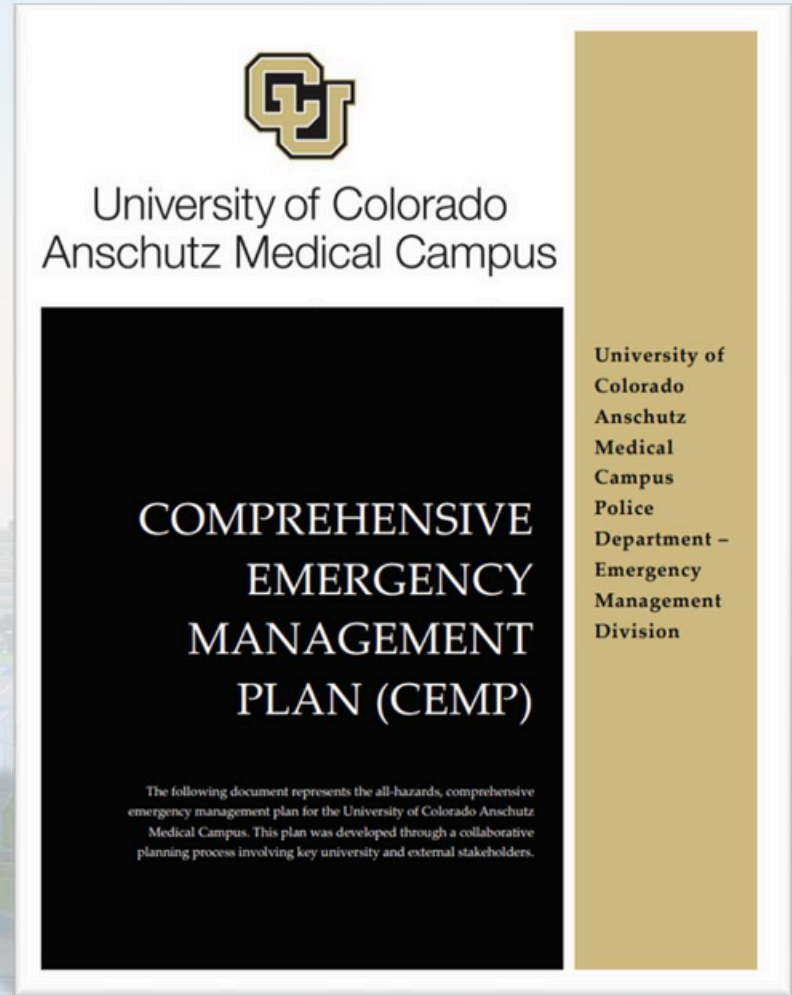

The Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP), establishes the basis for providing emergency response resources and assistance to the campus community if impacted by emergency or disasters.

The CEMP covers all four phases of emergency management: mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery.

What is COOP?

An effort within individual executive departments and agencies to ensure that Primary Mission Essential Functions (PMEFs) continue to be performed during a wide range of emergencies, including localized acts of nature, accidents and technological or attack-related emergencies (Inclement Weather).

Why is it Important?

Planning fosters recovery and survival in and after emergency situations. COOP establishes processes and procedures that allow for the continuation of essential functions when you can't be in your normal workspace, or a significant portion of your staff is absent (COVID-19).

Response

Response activities that address the short-term, direct effects of an incident. Response includes immediate actions to save lives, protect property, and meet basic human needs. Response also includes the execution of emergency operations plans and of mitigation activities designed to limit the loss of life, personal injury, property damage, and other unfavorable outcomes.
