- i. Began to help as an effort to save the life of the CEO, he was diagnosed with leukemia, and to treat his leukemia, he needed to find a bone marrow match from a donor.
 - ii. If you would like to host a drive, there is additional information available
 - iii. Diversity in registry is important; they work on trying to improve diversity to improve odds for finding match in registry.

- c. Legacy Fun Group – Alison O'Dell & Brian Fidelibus
- i. Legacy Fun Group Event – located at the Lone Tree Campus
 - ii. The mission is to foster an inclusive environment for students to find a sense of community.
 - iii. Event Planned for 12/13, Graduation is next day on 12/14
 - iv. Will provide food, games, mini lecture from Dr. Tammy Spencer, hands on time in the CEC.
 - v. Expecting ~200 guests
 - vi. Opened the floor to questions from Senators:
 1. They are open to making this event open to everyone and marketing it to the whole campus.
 2. 200 People is the expected attendance – 70 students + at least 1 person per student.
 3. Plan to seek out other financial sources – their program, nursing dean, nursing student council
 4. They are willing to cut down their budget, but non-negotiable are the fees and some form of food.
 5. Can utilize campus resources for rental games.
 6. The caterer has to be approved by the university as a vendor, it can take up to 6 weeks
 7. Deadline?
 - a. Next Tuesday (November 12) is the soft deadline for forms for them to ask for money to their school/program
 8. There is a \$200 gap in the proposed budget and itemized list so they can “play it safe” as they cannot go over the budget
 - vii. Internal discussion began at 6:07pm. Discussed for 30-40 minutes about logistics of funding this organization.

- viii. Official vote:
 - 1. V brought motion to floor \$1500, to cover DCSD and deficit can be fund raised, stipulation that Student Senate funded event
 - a. Hunter seconded motion
 - b. Almost everyone said “I”, two opposed
 - i. Those opposed had concerns about this event not being for the entire student population.
 - 2. V motioned again for \$1500 for proposal
 - a. Second vote
 - b. In favor: 24 people
 - c. Opposed: 1 opposed
 - d. Motion was passed by Alicia, will communicate clearly it was a one-time thing, if they go over, they need to come up with the money.

IV. Reports

- a. President – Alicia T.
 - i. Met with President Saliman,
 - 1. Did we feel included in CU system, Anschutz, in favor of opening discussion about identity.
 - 2. Regent's meeting happening Thursday and Friday.
- b. Vice-President – Alex H.
 - i. Went to the same meeting with President Saliman
 - ii. Still waiting to hear back regarding Health and Wellness Task force decision from Chancellor Elliman
- c. Vice-President of JEDI – Michelle B.
 - i. Marissa gave a quick presentation on behalf of Michelle.
 - ii. Trying to increase the budget for the World Diversity Fest which will occur in April 2025
 - iii. Have local food vendors and want to provide more vendors
 - iv. They hope to feed at least 150 people, so \$2250 each.
 - v. Additional costs: world map, raffle gifts, photo backdrop, plates, napkins, printing, stickers total for decor \$920
 - vi. Contact: michelle.bui@cuanschutz.edu
 - vii. Last year cost: \$3800 to serve 100 students. Empower CU contributed 50% and Student Senate contributed 50%
 - viii. If student senate does not contribute to staffing, there is an opposition to approving the increase in budget
 - ix. Dora moves to increase the budget to \$4000
 - 1. Leah seconded the motion
 - 2. Everyone said I: 24 people
 - 3. No one opposed
