# **COAHEC STUDENT HOUSING**

COAHEC provides support for students placed in rural/underserved Colorado locations for away clinical rotations.



The intent of COAHEC housing is to assist students with housing accommodations within the same local community in which their clinical rotation is located. This support facilitates the student's engagement with the community and the ability of the community to recruit them for future service.

For students who request COAHEC arranged housing, AHEC regional centers' housing coordinators will secure housing.

Students must request COAHEC arranged housing at least six (6) weeks before the start of their rotation to give the AHEC regional housing coordinators time to secure housing.

The AHEC regional housing coordinators do not begin securing housing until the student requests COAHEC arranged housing.



AHEC regional housing coordinators will provide housing as close to the rotation as possible within the community hosting the clinical rotation.

The majority of COAHEC arranged housing occurs in host homes but other housing may be in a regional AHEC-leased or -owned property. Placement of the student is at the discretion of the AHEC regional coordinator.

COAHEC housing is provided for the duration of nights on the rotation plus one (1) night prior for travel.

COAHEC Arranged housing is **NOT** guaranteed.

Our AHEC regional housing coordinators work hard and do a great job matching students with approved housing for their clinical rotations. Some areas may prove to be more difficult to secure housing than others.

COAHEC provides more than 24,000 nights of housing annually.

## ALL COAHEC HOST HOMES or REGIONAL AHEC OWNED/ LEASED HOUSING PROVIDE (at a minimum):

- 24/7 access to the home
- Private bedroom with lock
- Private or shared bathroom
- Kitchen access
- Available parking
- Non-smoking environment
- Working smoke and carbon dioxide detectors
- Fire escape plan







When the AHEC regional housing coordinator confirms housing with the student, the student must contact their host to:

- Confirm rotation dates and coordinate their arrival
- Determine what they need to bring, e.g., pots and pans, bed linens, and towels
- Upon arrival, the student should ask the host to share the "house rules" Specifically discuss any expectations regarding the safety and security of the house (locking doors, etc.), storage, and bed linens while the student resides in COAHEC arranged housing









#### While in COAHEC ARRANGED HOUSING



Students must provide their own transportation throughout their rotation and discuss parking restrictions with the host. Any costs associated with mileage, parking, or being towed for parking in a restricted area are the student's responsibility and will not be paid by COAHEC.



Wi-Fi is not guaranteed in all housing situations. However, AHEC regional housing coordinators will assist in locating Wi-Fi in their community.



Students may not use the host address for receiving mail unless approved by the host.



Students must use their personal cell phone for communication.



Students share a kitchen and may share bathroom facilities with the host or a student of the opposite sex or gender. The student is required to purchase and prepare their own meals and provide their own toiletries. In addition, students may have to provide bed linens and towels.





#### While in COAHEC ARRANGED HOUSING



Students are expected to keep the bathroom, bedroom and all common areas tidy; clean up in the kitchen including counters, stove, and dishes used in their meal prepping; laundry facilities if applicable; and leave their spaces clean upon departure. Students are responsible for extra costs related to cleaning or damage to the host home or regional AHEC owned or leased property.



Students MAY NOT HOST overnight guests, visitors, or house pets.



Students will remain smoke free and drug free. This includes no use of cigarettes, vaping, chewing tobacco, marijuana, recreational drugs (including edibles), and illicit drugs during their stay. Alcohol is also not permitted in host homes. Weapons of any kind including firearms, knives, explosives (fireworks, ammunition, etc.), bow and arrows, paint or BB guns, or any item that is a reasonable facsimile are not permitted at any time.





#### **Manage Your Expectations**

You will be placed in a rural or underserved community away from the Denver Metro area. The majority of placements are in host homes.

You may have limited or no public transportation, internet access, and other resources.

Many homes have pets and or farm animals. Roosters may wake you up in the morning. It's all part of the rural experience.

Hosts consider themselves ambassadors for their community. Please respect them and their home.

Which rotations are eligible for COAHEC student-found housing?

- Rotations that are a minimum of 40 miles from the CU Anschutz Medical Campus
- Rotations submitted by a school's coordinator to COAHEC's housing system
- Rotations in which a student is not living in their primary residence

Which rotations are <u>NOT</u> eligible for COAHEC student-found housing?

- Rotations less than 40 miles from the CU Anschutz Medical Campus
- Out of state rotations
- Residents, paid interns, and pre-health students, SOM LIC rotations.

University of Colorado 21 Anschutz Medical Campus

The student is responsible for securing housing and payment for their housing during their rotation and must submit for reimbursement at the end of their rotation.

- Students must request student-found housing before the start of their rotation.
- Student-found housing is not vetted nor required to meet any safety requirements.
- Lodging with your immediate family (parents and siblings) is not eligible for reimbursement.



- Students will be reimbursed for the amount <u>paid</u> up to \$23.00 per night, for nights of rotation only, plus one (1) night prior for travel.
- Students must submit for reimbursement with an official rent receipt form\* to coahechousing@cuanschutz.edu within 45 days of the end of the rotation. All reimbursements are processed at the end of the rotation.
- Travel expenses such as gas, mileage, car, truck, RV rentals, or food are not billable or reimbursable.

\* The official rent receipt form is attached to the confirmation e-mail sent to students when student-found housing is requested. It can also be found on our website cuanschutz.edu/centers/coahec







#### **COVID-19 NOTICE**

The University of Colorado requires all students, faculty, and staff to verify vaccination on or before September 2021.

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the need to appropriately respond to instances of COVID-19 in the community from a public health perspective, the University requires all students to fill out a self-report and submit such self-report to the University if they are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, have had a known exposure to COVID-19, or test positive for COVID-19.

The University expects students to inform their host, preceptor, and COAHEC regional coordinator regarding COVID-19 symptoms, exposure, or status.

The University, COAHEC regional coordinator, student, and host will work together to determine next steps with respect to the homestay on a case-by-case basis.

Students are also required to comply with University travel restrictions while on away rotations.

Students <u>MUST</u> request COAHEC housing six (6) weeks before the start of the rotation or as soon as possible to give the AHEC regional housing coordinators time to secure housing.

Students must read, agree to, abide by, and e-sign the student housing contract, and acknowledge the COAHEC housing policy's receipt when requesting housing.

Students will receive copies of the student housing contract and COAHEC's housing policy via e-mail after requesting housing. The <u>COAHEC housing policy</u> and the <u>student housing contract</u> can also be found on our website- <u>cuanschutz.edu/coahec/centers.</u>

When requesting COAHEC housing:

- Use the personalized link provided in the notification of eligible rotation e-mail sent from <u>coahechousing@cuanschutz.edu</u>
- Always use your CUANSCHUTZ.EDU e-mail
- It is important to list any allergies, restrictions, or details. The AHEC regional housing coordinator will take these into consideration when looking for housing

A confirmation e-mail will be sent from <u>coahechousing@cuanschutz.edu</u> confirming your housing request. If this is not correct, please return to the form using your personalized link and correct it.



#### You've requested COAHEC Arranged housing, now what?







You will receive an e-mail confirming your housing request from <u>coahechousing@cuanschutz.edu</u> with the AHEC regional housing coordinator's contact information.

Your AHEC regional housing coordinator will reach out to you via e-mail 21 days before your rotation with your housing status.

You may reach out at anytime to your AHEC regional housing coordinator to find out the status of your housing.

If you haven't heard from your AHEC regional housing coordinator regarding your housing status within 21 days of the start of the rotation, contact your AHEC regional housing coordinator and the COAHEC program office immediately at coahechousing@cuanschutz.edu.





When your AHEC regional housing coordinator has secured housing, you will be contacted via e-mail. You may decline housing, with cause, within three (3) business days and revert your housing request to student found.

If you fail to reply to the confirmation e-mail within three (3) business days, housing is considered accepted, and your school will be responsible for the cost of housing for this rotation.

Remember, COAHEC arranged housing is not guaranteed. Be prepared to find your own housing, especially in those areas with limited housing. You may change your request to student-found anytime before housing has been confirmed by your AHEC regional housing coordinator and accepted by you. You may change your housing request from student-found housing to COAHEC arranged housing; however, you must adhere to all timelines within the housing policy for requesting COAHEC arranged housing.





## **COAHEC HOUSING POLICY**

Familiarize yourself with the COAHEC housing policy and the student housing contract.

- You acknowledge you have read and understood this policy when you e-sign the student contract
- If you violate the housing policy, the issue is forwarded to the Office of Student Affairs

# COMMUNICATION

It is important to stay in communication with your AHEC regional housing coordinator throughout your rotation. They know the hosts, preceptors, and their community. They are here to help.

Your AHEC regional housing coordinator is your main point of contact throughout your rotation.

If you have a question or an issue regarding your housing accommodations, the AHEC regional housing coordinator should be contacted first, or at the least, cc'd on all communication.

You may also contact the COAHEC program office at <u>coahechousing@cuanschutz.edu</u>. Please cc your school coordinator, and your AHEC regional housing coordinator on all communications.





#### You've requested COAHEC Student-found housing, now what?







You will receive an e-mail confirming your student-found housing request from coahechousing@cuanschutz.edu with the official rent receipt as an attachment.

You are responsible for payment; this is a reimbursement not a stipend.

You must submit the official rent receipt within 45 days of the end of your rotation.

The AHEC regional housing coordinator is there for support and will reach out to you sometime during your rotation.

You may reach out to <u>COAHEChousing@cuanschutz.edu</u> on the status of your payment 2 weeks after submission.





## NOTE

Your **school coordinator** is cc'd on all notification emails.

Only a school coordinator can cancel a rotation.
