



KEYNOTE SPEAKER

DR. KATRINA CLAW

Dr. Katrina G. Claw, PhD (she/her) is an Assistant Professor at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus in the Division of Biomedical Informatics and Personalized Medicine (BIPM). Broadly, her research focuses on personalizing medicine, pharmacogenomics, and the ethical, legal, and social, cultural implications of genomic research with American Indian/Alaska Native and other Indigenous communities. At the core of her research is using community-engaged approaches and ethical frameworks throughout the research process. Dr. Claw grew up on the Navajo Nation and is an enrolled member of the Navajo (Diné) tribe. She obtained her BS in Biology and BA in Anthropology from Arizona State University; her PhD in Genome Sciences from the University of Washington in Seattle, WA in 2013.
